1. Definitions

Here you can find the meanings of the most important terms in this Cookie Policy to help you understand who and for what we are Processing your Personal Data.

- **Cookie(s)** - small pieces of information stored by the Visitor's browser on the hard disk of the computer of any other device of the Visitor.
- **Personal Data** - means any information which FINRAX directly relates to you (a legal or natural person or an organization legally engaged in business activities or any other business).
